Monthly Update

Regular Meeting November 8, 2017

Meeting called to order at 12:00 p.m. by President Callie Stanhope. After introductions and buffet lunch, the regular meeting commenced.

Dave Hundt and Tim Groth spoke with the membership concerning the lack of parking in the downtown area. Mr. Hundt explained the former Contractor Supply property is presently used for parking. If this property is sold, the public may not have access to this area for parking. It is also important for Village Park activities and for the annual June Dairy Days celebration. Mr. Hundt talked with the Village Board to support and encourage the Village to purchase the former Contractor Supply property for downtown parking. Mr. Hundt is requesting the West Salem Business Association endorse this request for the Village to buy the property.

Motion by Denise Jones, seconded by Nicole Vidal directing the Business Association Board of Directors to write a letter to the Village Board of Trustees in support of the Village purchasing the former Contractor Supply property. Motion unanimously approved.

Guest Speaker Nick Ragner, Development Director for The Salvation Army then updated the membership on the agency's activities and requests for bell ringers in West Salem.

Dedicated in December 2000, and expanded in 2003, it has 9,500 square feet of space where a Branch Supervisor, four Library Clerks, one Assistant Youth Services Staff member and two Library Pages are employed. The West Salem library branch is open Monday, Wednesday and Thursday from 10 am - 8 pm, Tuesday from 1 pm - 8 pm, Friday from 10 am - 5 pm and Saturday from 9 am - 2 pm.

We offer a variety of materials for check-out including books, audiobooks, DVD's, magazines, cds, children's materials and more. The La Crosse County Library System being part of the WRLS Library System allows us access to materials in over 38 different libraries!
