Downtown Trick-or-Treating is fast approaching. Downtown Trick-or-Treating will be held on **Tuesday, October 31**, <u>from 3:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m.</u>

This free community event will provide a safe and unique trick-or-treating experience for families. Costumed children (age 12 and under) will trick-or-treat outdoors from 3:00-5:00 pm on Tuesday, October 31 by going between downtown businesses (on Leonard St.) and booths set up in West Salem Village Park to get their bag filled with goodies.

We are encouraging businesses and organizations to consider hosting a Trunk-Or-

Treating booth in Village Park to promote a safe central location for kids to go. As safety is a prime concern, we would like to aid in getting kids off the street and into the park, away from traffic. This option will also provide businesses with small offices the ability to reduce congestion at their place of work.

If you're in one of these zones, you've already received an e-mail from us saying your home is ready to apply for service & schedule your installation. Our contractor, Steiger Construction, continues to work their way through West Salem. If your neighborhood has had mainline and drops (fiber that runs from the mainline to your home) installed, you're in an area that is getting close to being able to apply for service. Please watch your e-mail for a message that you can go online, select services, and schedule your installation.

When it's time to bury fiber to your home our contractors will get in touch with you via a visit, e-mail, or phone call. They will be asking where you would like the fiber to come into your home and if there are any buried private utilities, sprinkler systems, underground dog fences, etc. in your yard. When they reach out to you, please respond so we can keep the work moving along in your neighborhood. Thank you!

WHAT IS THIS? AND WHY IS IT IN THE RIGHT-OF-WAY?



These orange posts are markers for our fiber; they hold the ground wires that connect to the fiber. The primary purpose of the posts is for locating. Other companies will use a metal pedestal instead of a post, which are bigger and roughly two years out to order right now because of supply issues. Other fiber providers will also leave ground cables lying in the handhole (a handhole is an underground vault that provides access to fiber optic cable and other utilities for splicing & repairs) with no chance of locating the fiber line in wet or frozen conditions. This makes the fiber not locatable when work needs to be done in these conditions and increases your chance of having issues with your service due to a fiber cut. In addition to locates, the posts keep snowplows from driving over and crushing our handholes in the winter (if that happened, we'd have to dig up your yard again to repair the handhole and no one wants that). So... having the fiber wires accessible from these orange posts makes locating the fiber lines easy and is one of the things that makes our network more stable and dependable.
